The CCT is a 13 to 15 mile bus rapid transit (BRT) or light rail transit (LRT) transitway that would extend north from the Shady Grove Metrorail Station in Rockville to COMSAT, just south of Clarksburg, MD in Montgomery County. The CCT is the transit component of the I-270/US 15 Multi-Modal Corridor Study, a joint multi-modal study initiated by the Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) and the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA). The I-270/US 15 Multi-Modal Corridor Study consists of the several combinations of highway strategies, the CCT and other transit options to address congestion, improve safety, and increase mobility along the I-270/US 15 Corridor from the Shady Grove Metro Station (Montgomery County) to north of Biggs Ford Road (Frederick County).

The Supplemental Environmental Assessment Open House and Public Hearing is being offered to provide all interested persons the opportunity to learn about and express their opinions about recent project developments. The Open House portion of the meeting will provide information about the proposed improvements and the results of the environmental analysis through written information, displays and multi-media presentations. Project staff will be available to discuss the project and answer questions. In addition, this meeting will act as a public hearing for the completion of the Supplemental Environmental Assessment. Interested persons will be afforded the opportunity to present their views regarding the proposed project and the Supplemental Environmental Assessment document by providing private or public oral testimony documented by a court reporter and/or written testimony as preferred. All comments provided at the hearing and during the document public comment period will be carefully considered by project staff and will become part of the project public record. Comment Forms will be available at the open house.

The purpose of the Supplemental Environmental Assessment (SEA) document is to evaluate the three new alignment modifications developed by MTA at the request of the Montgomery County Council and the City of Gaithersburg to meet the Counties' new development plans in the Gaithersburg area. The document evaluates the effects of the proposed alignment modifications on the natural and human environments and assesses the impacts on transit performance. The alternative modifications include:

- A modified alignment traversing Crown Farm through the heart of a new transit-oriented mixed-use development with a station near the center of the new development;
- A new route proposed to serve the expanded Life Sciences Center (LSC) located near the intersection of Great Seneca Highway and Key West Avenue; and
- An alignment shift that puts the transitway on the west side of Great Seneca Highway to directly serve a Kentlands shopping center proposed for redevelopment into a mixed-use transit-supportive destination.

Beginning at 4:00 PM, mapping depicting the project alternatives and other information regarding the project will be available for public viewing. Representatives of MTA will be available to record your comments and discuss points of interest with you. SHA representatives will also be available to record comments on the I-270/US 15 Study. There will not be a

formal presentation; however public testimony for the project's record will begin at 6:00 PM. The opportunity to provide testimony privately will also be provided, starting at 4:00 PM.

If you received a copy of this notice in the mail, you are currently on the project mailing list. Those persons who signed up to be placed on the mailing list will be kept informed of project developments as the study progresses.

Individuals seeking to provide testimony will be placed on the speakers' list for this Public Hearing during on-site registration the night of the hearing. Elected officials will be given the opportunity to speak before those on the speakers' list. After the elected officials, the speakers will be called in the order in which their requests were received. Attendees at the Public Hearing who desire to speak may do so after those on the previously established list. Due to the large number of speakers anticipated, comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per speaker.
